

Historic Homes of Gaylord: Architectural Evaluations

Address: 120 N. Center/ James A. Quick House

No. of Stories: 2.5

Exterior Wall Surface Material/s: brick lower story/ shake shingle upper story

Roof Shape/Materials: hipped with lower cross gables/octagonal asphalt shingle

Foundation Material/s: rusticated block

Primary Window Type/ Material/s: skinny 1 over 1 double hung

Special Identifying Features: wraparound porch, rooftop porch, asymmetrical
balance, hip roof with centrally located chimneys,
diamond window, corner entry

Approximate age: late 19th century

Architectural Description: Free Classic Style Queen Anne (1880-1910):

Historic photos show this home was once a pristine example of a free classic Queen Anne. The wraparound porch was supported with classical Tuscan columns, the gables were fish-scale shingled, and the rooftop was even decorated with ornate finials. Although the classical columns have been removed and replaced with brick supports, this home still has a very high value of historical integrity, and could easily be restored to perfection.
