I'm finally getting my information together for you. Our home was originally owned by Sanford Buck. I believe he had it built. Then it was sold to Floyd Sisson. On April 5 1933 my grandparents , William and Jennie Wilson purchased the home from the Sisson's. The following year my Uncle and Aunt, Leon and Iva Wilson bought into it and it became a partnership. My grandfather and uncle built the gas station and 12 cabins . All of the logs for the cabins and gas station , and also the Rendezvous Restaurant, were timbered and hauled for the buildings by my husband's grandfather and uncles. The Manier Family. In 1945 my grandfather passed away and my uncle sold his portion to my father and mother, George and Mildred Wilson. So it was a partnership with my folks and my grandmother until they sold it in 1958. Back in 1946, my father built the Log O Tel out in back of the house where the brick building is now standing. The gas station was sold to Harry Green, and then to Mike Pomarzynski. After that I don't know the owners. There have been 5 owners since my folks owned it. I am enclosing pictures of the home and it's changes since the early 1900's. The first picture about 1903 was when the Buck's owned it. The second one is how it looked when my grandparents purchased it. If you notice the mulberry tree , it kind of drapes, is still out front today. The next picture is during the time Wayne Brown owned it. The new one is how it looks now since Tom and Sandy Koch redid it. I'm not sure if there is any other information you need, if so please let me know.
