Address: 207 N. Center/ Brodie House

Exterior Wall Surface Material/s: wide plank siding/ wood

Spindlework Queen Anne (1880-1910):

Most of the home's Spindelwork detailing has been removed, however the wraparound porch, turret and 2-storey porch still identify the home as a Queen Anne. The home's original gingerbread remains intact, but sadly, most of the original spindlework was lost when the wraparound porch was "craftsman-ized". Photographs also show the skinny clapboard, which was original to most Queen Anne's, especially spindlework, has also been replaced.
