### Architectural Description:

#### Vernacular Queen Anne (1880-1910):

The homes L-shaped plan and asymmetrical massing are typical features of a Queen Anne home. The home is a good example of a simplified version of the Queen Anne. This is accomplished through the elaborate bay and fish-scale details. Historic photos should lead to more clues.
