He located here in 1881, coming from Seaforth, Ont., and engaged in the manufacture of wagons and vehicles. Failing health forced him to make a change of occupation and disposing of his business to Durst & Bruder went to Chicago in 1893 where he became city salesman and manager for a large branch carriage house in that city in which capacity he continued for six years. The branch was closed and for the six years following he traveled over a greater portion of the Untied States as sales manager.
