Architectural Description: Half-Timbered Queen Anne (1880-1910):

These style homes are quite unique, as the have characteristics similar to both the Tudor and Stick styles. Only about 5 percent of all Queen Anne homes are half-timbered. This home should be considered the gem of Gaylord, because it has been restored to historically correct perfection by Margaret and Jerry Albert.
