

## Historic Homes of Gaylord: Architectural Evaluations

### Architectural Description:

#### Vernacular Queen Anne (1880-1910):

Although the exterior of the home has been dramatically altered, historic photos show the home once had gingerbread detailing, fish-scale gables and turned porch and railing supports. These original, elaborate Queen Anne details have been lost, and a large one-story addition has been erected on the north side of the home. This home too was “Craftsman-ized” when the front porch was extended and craftsman style supports were added.
