Gothic Revival (1840-1880):

This home has more historical features intact than most homes in Gaylord. The home features a steeply pitched, gothic style gable and two pairs of gothic style lancet windows. All original vergeboards and fretwork are still intact. Even the home's exterior cellar entry is original. The home is one of very few gothic revivals in Gaylord, and even featured medieval-esque parapets atop both bays.
